Voter Registration Deadline: Oct. 21

A lot is at stake in the upcoming November 2024 election – and your work picture is a big part of that. We are ramping up our electoral outreach this year, and each of our members plays a critical role.

In 2024, the IBEW has had our work cut out for us – from protecting collective bargaining and workers' rights to capitalizing on the massive work opportunities presented by recently passed federal infrastructure and energy bills. Because of them, ground is breaking on projects across the country, from semiconductor plants to new transmission lines to high-speed railroads, all with strong labor standards. As a result of these laws, demand for electricians is expected to spike in 2030. IBEW's membership is climbing and these bills enacted over the past three years give us an unprecedented opportunity to expand our ranks and strengthen our work outlook.

Informed IBEW members who are registered and armed with

the facts necessary to vote for candidates who support us are the most important piece of our 2024 mobilization plan. 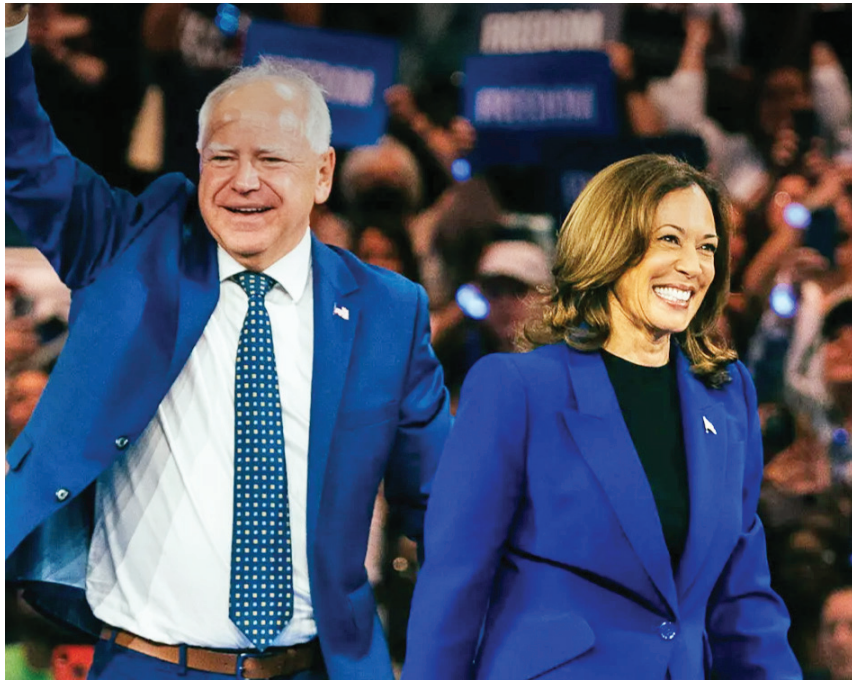

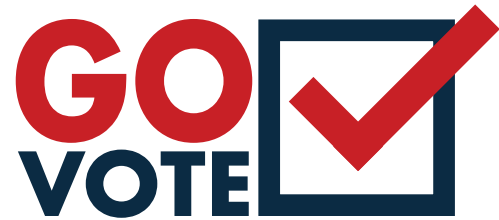

LA County Measure A – YES

Also called the “Affordable Housing, Homelessness Solutions and Prevention Now” measure, Measure A will replace a quarter-cent sales tax with a half-cent sales tax to help fund housing and homeless services. Money from the tax, forecast to generate about \$1.2 billion annually, would go toward affordable housing, mental health care and substance abuse treatment, among other homeless services.

LAUSD Facilities Bond Measure US – YES

Los Angeles Unified School District’s Measure US, also called the “Local Public Schools Safety and Upgrades Measure,” is a \$9 billion bond to upgrade and improve school facilities. The bond would be paid for through property taxes, 2.5 cents per \$100 assessed value annually. Widespread campus modernization will lead to construction jobs. More than 60 percent of school buildings are more than 50 years old and in need of improvements.

Long Beach City College Bond Measure AC - YES

Measure AC in Long Beach is a college facilities bond measure to complete repairs and upgrades to Long Beach City College facilities. Also called the “Long Beach Community College District affordable education, classroom repair, career and first responder training improvement measure,” AC will authorize \$990,000,000 in bonds funded by \$25 per year for every \$100,000 of assessed property value. The measure will create numerous job opportunities.
